"I have never called them that and I will not," said the bishop. "I do not believe we should be fanning the flames and calling them baby killers or murderers. It isn't right."

Dudley emphasized that he believes there must be an understanding that "if there is life at conception, or if there is any doubt about it, then I firmly believe we should be protecting that life in the womb. If we do not, then that is taking a life.

"People say I'm out to get McGovern, but that isn't so," said the bishop.

"I disagree with him on his pro-choice abortion stand and I agree with him on his death penalty stand.

I agree with Gov. Bill Janklow on his pro-life stand; I disagree with him on his death penalty stand. I would say both men are inconsistent.

"We have to be concerned about the emotions of some people who speak for pro-life, but we have to make sure that the issue is life. We have to discuss it with positiveness and at the same time we have to talk about it with kindness and love," he said.

Bishop Dudley said he was writing a letter to all clergy in his diocese asking the people of the parishes to treat the matter "with kindness and love" and not to involve themselves with politics and personalities.
